2010 National Jamboree

Attention all Scouts and Scouters! We want you to attend the National Jamboree, if you are a Scout you have to be at least 12 years of age by July 1, 2010, but not have reached your 18th birthday by August 4, 2010. Then you need to go onto www.Scouting.org and enter in your application to join us at A.P. Hill.

This year the National Scout Jamboree will use an online application process for all Scouts, Leaders and Jamboree Staff Applicants desiring to attend the Jamboree. Interested youth must complete the on online Application and pay \$10.00. Once you fill out the application you will be asked to print a confirmation, you will need to get your Scoutmaster's signature of approval and return it to your local council along with your initial deposit of \$100. The application can be found on www.Scouting.org. Applicants who submit completed application to the council office on or before for 12/31/2008 will receive a discount of \$150.00. Making your jamboree fee (\$1600.00) applicants after this date may be subject to higher fee schedule.
